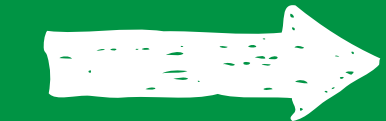
The Journey Toward Fidelity for an Evolving Child Welfare Practice Model

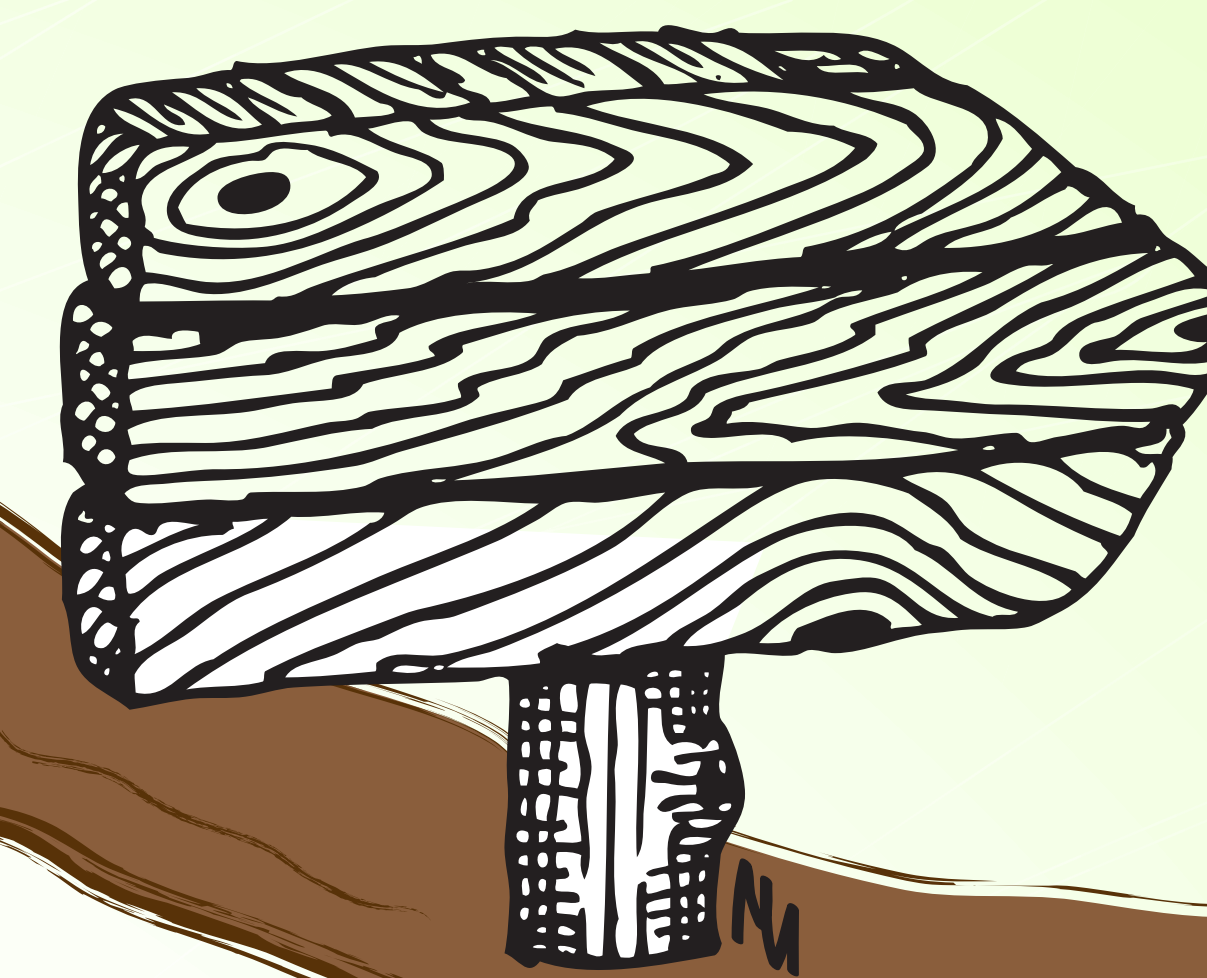


Looking ahead toward refining the practice model and implementation supports to achieve our desired outcomes.
