

Recommended Topics to Consider for Training on Child Labor Trafficking

In 2020, Child and Family Policy Institute (CFPIC) Preventing and Addressing Child Trafficking Project, released a brief titled The Child Welfare Response to Child Labor Trafficking in California, which outlined lessons learned through a ten-county, child welfare agency, case study. The resulting document serves as a resource for child welfare agencies, advocates, and policymakers who hope to strengthen their existing child trafficking response to be inclusive of all forms of child trafficking (for the purposes of sex and/or labor). Beginning in early 2020, CFPIC has collaborated with key service providers to develop regional trainings which address child labor trafficking in several PACT Counties and hopes to make these opportunities more readily available in the future.
