<p>Teaming and Engagement</p>	<p>Consistent modeling of CPM behaviors in all interactions with staff and partners</p> <p>Broad and Inclusive engagement of internal, system and community partners</p> <p>Shared value, creation, accountability and commitment and for collaborative work</p> <p>Regular and on-going self-assessment involving partners</p> <p>Partners have clear meaningful roles that are linked to leadership and implementation teams</p> <p>Partnerships and partner activities are embedded in the infrastructure</p>	<p>Inconsistent modeling of CPM in interactions with staff and partners</p> <p>Limited engagement of some partners; partners not fully and meaningfully involved in system change processes</p> <p>Invited to the table but asked to adopt system values</p> <p>One-time assessment, limited involvement of partners</p> <p>Lack of clarity about roles</p> <p>Partnership loses momentum with turnover of leadership or key stakeholders</p>	<p>Not committed to modeling CPM behaviors in all interactions</p> <p>No engagement of some or any partners in system change efforts</p> <p>One or few stakeholders invited to the table but not meaningfully involved, encouraged to participate or whose input is clearly valued</p> <p>Perspective of partners not sought out in assessment of current system</p> <p>Partnerships and partner activities considered 'outside' boundaries of the infrastructure</p>
<p>Inquiry and Exploration</p>	<p>Model cultural humility</p> <p>Listening to and being authentically responsive to historic trauma</p> <p>Be open to and lean in to crucial conversations</p> <p>Safe Space for all</p> <p>All voices and perspectives have value</p> <p>Cultural framing and contributions are celebrated</p> <p>Language is accessible</p> <p>Model appreciative inquiry and explore</p>	<p>Partners are contributing but system voices hold more weight and value than community</p> <p>Only open to perspective that is in alignment with system</p> <p>Inconsistent modeling from different leaders or at different times</p> <p>Uncomfortable with conflict in the relationship or insecurity that the partnership can sustain relationship bumps in the road</p>	<p>Shutting down the voices of partners and community</p> <p>Stopping the work when hit bumps in the road or when crucial conversations are necessary</p> <p>Use of inaccessible language in meetings and expecting present community to translate</p> <p>Not inviting partners to the table that have gripes with the system</p>

<p>Advocacy and Accountability</p>	<p>Leaders are reaching out early in implementation efforts to invite stakeholders to partner with them in the work</p> <p>Leaders are actively seeking out and incorporating input from community, system and staff</p> <p>Contracts are developed to meet communities' needs and model values of CPM; non-traditional community providers have increasing access to contracts</p> <p>Feedback loops are consistent</p>	<p>Leaders are reaching out late in the development process but are seeking out partner input in implementation efforts</p> <p>Contracts are developed with traditional providers; may have core values of CPM presented to them in a meeting</p> <p>Non-traditional providers lack consistent access to RFPs and opportunities for contracting</p> <p>Feedback loops inconsistent</p>	<p>Leaders stifling partner voice or feel forced to invite partners to the table</p> <p>Only encourage involvement of traditional contractors/system; limiting opportunities for new partners coming to the table</p> <p>Contracts lack CPM-related language or expectations</p> <p>No expectation or accountability around stakeholder participation</p>
